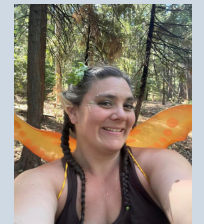
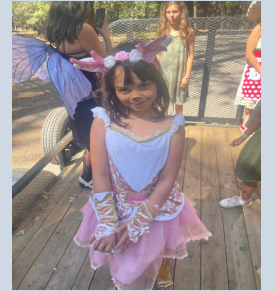
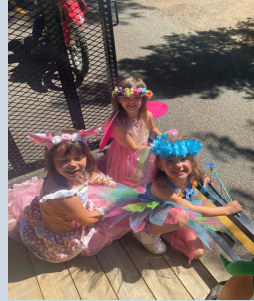

Many people stopped by the Fire Safe Council booth at the bazaar. Butte County Office of Emergency Management had a wonderful representative, Angie, at the booth to look up addresses and clarify people’s zones. Thank you, Angie. Our own Cohasset Fire Safe Council handed out refrigerator magnets with the zone numbers on them, to help residents remember their zone. If you weren’t able to attend the bazaar, or didn’t get by to pick up a magnet, and would like one, they will be available at the next CFSC meeting in September.

Thank you also to Lauren from the Butte Fire Safe Council for bringing Ready Raccoon to our community, and for bringing pamphlets containing important information about defensible space and evacuation preparedness. The Cohasset Fire Safe Council and the Butte Fire Safe Council work together year-round to help spread the word about fire prevention, preparedness and safety to our community.



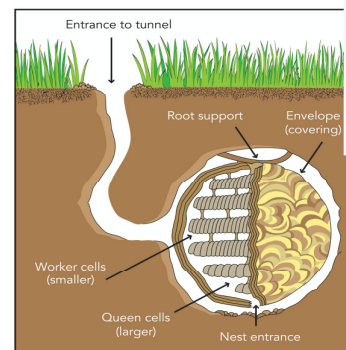
Cohasset’s own Harey the Prepared Hare rode in this year’s parade and also got to greet the children with treats and stickers. In the future we hope to see a lot more of Harey, as he helps to spread the word about fire safety, evacuation, and preparedness. So, be looking for more children’s programs on this subject in the future.

The next Cohasset Fire Safe Council meeting is scheduled for September 19<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm at the CCA. This meeting will be geared towards preparing children, and families with children, to evacuate in the event of a fire. Things to be discussed will be: 1. preparing children’s go-bags, 2. where the family members will meet up if there’s a fire and no adult is home, 3. what contact numbers children should have in their go-bags, and 4. who it’s safe for a child to leave with (other than their parents) during an evacuation. All Cohasset families with children are welcome at this meeting. YES!!!! Absolutely, bring the children!

### **Got Meat Bees? Check this out!**

If you have an infestation of meat bees, the first thing to do is:

- ◆ Look around your property for the entrance to the hive. About a quarter size hole is a dead giveaway.
- ◆ Understand that these hives are about the size of a volleyball. If you find one, you might want to:
- ◆ Call Butte County Vector Control at 533-6038. They can remove these from your property for no cost to you.
- ◆ One of our residents had 8 of these hives removed from their property!



## It's Time to Join 4-H

Cohasset 4-H is set to launch a new year of fun filled projects and leadership opportunities. We are looking forward to seeing YOU and a parent at our first Community Meeting on Wednesday, September 7, at 6:00 p.m. in the CCA building. 4-H is open to all school age youth turning 5 by Dec. 31. If you fit in that age range come on out and see what we have to offer.

How does 4-H work in Cohasset? First, we have monthly community meetings on the first Wednesday of every month where all Cohasset members join together. They elect club officers and plan club wide activities, learn about countywide activities and about the projects offered by our local Cohasset club.

What projects will we be offering?

**Arts and Crafts:** This project usually meets the second Saturday of the month at the CCA building and does a variety of craft projects. Susana Malcolm leads this group.

**Cooking:** A chance to try out yummy recipes and learn cooking skills. Heather Lingemann will be leading this project.

**Welding:** In this project you will be making functional and artistic projects using torch cutting and welding skills. Jion Lingemann will be the leader of this project and you must be at least 9 years old to participate.

**Rabbits:** Learn rabbit care and showmanship, leading to a chance of showing and selling your animals at the fair. Elizabeth Pocock leads this project.

**Swine:** Learn pig care and showmanship, leading to a chance to show and sell you animal at the fair.

**Sewing:** A new project this year. Lori Hamilton will be leading this project.

Others; we are hoping to add some other new projects, as well, such as Poultry.

**Cross Clubbing:** Maybe you looked at all this and thought, but I have a friend who does a horse project, or maybe a quilt project with another club. Why can't I do that? The good news is, YOU CAN! If we don't offer the project of your dreams and it is offered with another club in Butte County, you can join the Cohasset Club and participate in the other club's project.

But you must be thinking, this is a lot of stuff. I can't do all that! We do have more projects than some much larger clubs. You can sign up for just one project that interests you or as many as you have time for.

If any of this sounds like fun to you, come to the meeting on **Sept. 7**, check us out and sign up if you would like. The annual cost is \$62 a year per member. We have scholarships available to pay a portion of the fees for families in need.

How do I sign up? You are now able to sign up on line. New and returning members can go to <http://cebutte.ucanr.edu/> to do so. They will direct you to 4-H Online. You can create a profile and enroll on line. If you have Internet access problems, you can fill out forms that we provide at the meeting. Whichever you choose you pay your fees to the Cohasset 4-H at the meeting or you can pay them on line when you register. There is an on line service fee if you do. # GMRS Radio Update



## Dear Fellow Cohassians,

Just a quick update on the GMRS radios. The number of folks getting these radios continues to grow! When all other sources of communications fail, these GMRS radios give you the ability to receive critical information.

There are two County GMRS repeaters, one on Platt Mountain and one on Bloomer, covering most of the County. There were only a couple of locations here in Cohasset that could not hear one or the other. The Sheriff made a commitment that CODE RED ALERTS would be put out over the GMRS system any time a CODE RED was issued.

What that means is that if you have a correctly programmed radio, keep it charged and turn it on, you have another means to get these critical alerts. You can also use them to talk to your neighbors and share local information.

We also have a GMRS Repeater here in Cohasset. Plans are in place to raise the tower an additional 30' within a month. This repeater is not used for chit chat, it is primarily devoted to sharing local information. During multiple events over the past 2+ years, our local radio group has been able to give eyes on information. If you are not able to hear the Cohasset Repeater, everything broadcast over Cohasset is then broadcast over the two

County repeaters so that almost all of Cohasset can hear the same information.

We have a very active GMRS Radio Group here in Cohasset willing to help you get started. Even if you never thought about getting a radio, let alone talk on one, you can listen to the information and make informed decisions for your families.
